- ii. Department of Water Resources released "Review of IRWM Planning and Implementation in California," a report which summarizes accomplishments, progress, opportunities, and improvements over the past 12 years. Comments on the report are currently being accepted.
- iii. The 2014 Water-Energy Grant Program has released the final Guidelines and PSP. Applications for the grant are due in December and the maximum award per proposal is \$2.5 million. RRWA staff will forward relevant information to TWG members.
- Water Bond Coalition update
  - Daria Isupov explained that the \$7.5 billion water bond on November ballot will appear as *Proposition 1: Water Quality, Supply and Infrastructure Improvement Act of 2014.* Recent polling indicates that 58% of voters support Proposition 1.
  - Ann DuBay (SCWA) added that the Water Bond Coalition is strategizing on next steps for the coalition after the November election.
- Stormwater program update
  - o 2014 CASQA Conference RRWA presented on Sept 17
  - o CoPermittee update
    - i. Jenifer Piccinini (Santa Rosa) announced that Santa Rosa will submit a regional application for grant funding to help address the homeless encampment issues along creeks. The City of Santa Rosa currently spends approximately \$1 million per year for illegal disposal site abatement. Sonoma County will present on their task force at the upcoming CoPermittee meeting.
