There may be a second comment period depending on the first comment period, potentially pushing Board adoption to June. Colleen Hunt will present on the new permit to the Regional Board in March.

 - o The web outreach line item would benefit from a numerical goal after discussions with experts (SGA, or S2).
 - Social media subcommittee formed for initiating RRWA's Facebook and Twitter pages, with an initial focus on reformatting the Environmental Column to be better suited as a web presence.
 - Meg Lawrence (Healdsburg), Lisa Steinman (SCWMA), Will Stockard (Sonoma County), and Teresa Gudino (City of Santa Rosa) volunteered for the subcommittee.
 - RRWA's task force role for the homeless will be explored but if no followthrough then there will be a credit.
 - i. Short presentation at the January 6th, 2015 Co-Permittee meeting: UFO building at 10:30am.
 - o The one-on-one meetings are to be scheduled for the 2nd week in January, which will include a revised version of the work plan and information on social media.
 - Certain carwashes are becoming certified green businesses. Vouchers can be used as gifts/give-aways or as an online reward coupon. This is suggested as a potential project for RRWA to take on.
 - Level of interest for waste signs (for parks and trailheads) was low due to past ineffectiveness. Residential areas may be more worthwhile however it was decided that clean-up biodegradable bags would be more effective than signs. Bulk purchase potential for doggie-bags that clip onto leashes.
 - o Bulk purchase mood pencils other ideas are to be sent to Andy Rodgers.
